## Code of Conduct

SFI Academic IT Festival is a gathering event for young people interested in IT, entrepreneurs and well-known IT authorities. We would like SFI to be a part of the growth of the Polish IT community, especially in Cracow. We are willing to develop the potential of young people, inspire new and interesting initiatives and provide an opportunity to expand knowledge in a different way than usual.

### General principles

The purpose of SFI is to create a space for sharing ideas in a way that is completely free of prejudice and discrimination. We are open to all people regardless of gender, sexual orientation, handicaps, disability, race, nation, age, appearance or personal beliefs, including political and religious ones.

All statements and materials presented should be consistent with the fundamental principles of social coexistence and the culture of statements. This applies equally to participants, speakers and all related to the organisation of the Festival.

We will do our utmost to resolve any conflicts that may arise and we will provide the assistance needed. In case of inappropriate behaviour on the festival grounds, we reserve the right to take appropriate actions, including: warning, removing from the festival grounds or notifying the appropriate authorities.
